Prevent Burglaries: Keep Your Home Secure

By and large, Merle Hay is a safe, low-crime neighborhood. That does not mean we are immune to burglaries and other property crimes. Err on the side of calling Des Moines Police at 283-4811 if you see something suspicious. Dial 911 if it is an emergency. Here are some helpful tips on how to keep your home safe.

<u>Check Your Locks</u>: In nearly half of all residential burglaries, thieves enter through unlocked doors or windows. Make sure external doors have a deadbolt. Key-in-the-knob locks are not enough, according to Des Moines Police.

<u>Inside Your House:</u> If you are gone, make your house look and sound occupied. Use timers for lights, radios, and televisions, setting them to go on and off throughout the night.

<u>Work With Your Neighbors:</u> Join your neighborhood association or start a neighborhood watch. Collaborate with neighbors, community groups, and local government to combat blight and keep the neighborhood clean. The more presentable and attractive our neighborhood is, the less susceptible it is to crime.

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Details on Reopening of Moore Elementary School

The Des Moines Public Schools is excited to announce the reopening of Moore Elementary School, 3716 50th Street, for the 2015-2016 school year. Moore has a long history in the area first opening in 1950 and educating children in the Beaverdale and northwest Des Moines area until declining enrolling forced its closure in 2007. At that time it was used as a "swing school" while other buildings were under renovation and most recently as the location of Scavo High School. The building is currently undergoing a \$6.6 million renovation to include a new gymnasium, playground, state-of-the-art classrooms, technology, and security.

In addition to structural and surface updates, Moore Elementary will be able to offer its students more educational opportunities. Upon it's opening, Moore will begin the process to become an International Baccalaureate (IB) school allowing students to take advantage of a world class curriculum from grade school through middle and high school as Moore is a feeder school for both Meredith Middle School and Hoover High School, which are IB schools as well.

Construction crews are hard at work creating a first class school for neighborhood children and we anticipate a mid -August opening, just in time for the first day of school on August 26th. You are cordially invited to join us for a community-wide Open House on August 17th from 4:00-7:00 PM. We hope you will stop by, take a tour, and see what all the excitement is about. Additionally, mark your calendars for the official ribbon cutting on September 17th from 4:00-6:00.
