Keeping a watchful eye on vacant properties is an incredibly important part of keeping the Merle Hay neighborhood safe, stable, and desirable. When vacant properties are not well-maintained, they can really take a toll on property values and neighborhood perception. Here are some helpful tips on how to deal with vacant properties:

- -If a property appears to be in an unsafe or unstable condition, contact the City of Des Moines' Neighborhood Inspections Division (NID@dmgov.org) or (515) 283-4046.
- -If you see or suspect criminal activity, call Des Moines Police at 283-4811. Dial 911 for emergencies.
- -Report overgrown grass or weeds to the Polk County Weed Commission: 515.286.3005 or weedcommission@polkcountyiowa.gov.
