MHNA membership is open to anyone who lives or owns a business within MHNA's boundaries. Annual dues are payable at the annual meeting in January, or can be mailed to the association post office box listed on the front cover. Members may take part in MHNA decision-making on planning, development, zoning, infrastructure, streets and parks, beautification, and other community service and education projects, and social events. Associate memberships are available to those outside MHNA's boundaries, though associate members may not vote on MHNA business.

You're Invited! Douglas Avenue Coalition Open House on October 29th.

The Douglas Avenue Coalition (DAC) will host an Open House on Tuesday, October 29, to share information about proposed improvements to the Douglas Avenue Corridor between Merle Hay Road and the Des Moines River. The improvements aim to improve multi-modal safety, beautify the corridor, and facilitate the revitalization of the commercial nodes along Douglas Avenue. The effort is the culmination of more than two years' collaboration between DAC, the City of Des Moines, Polk County, the State of Iowa, and consulting firms RDG and HDR, along with extensive input from the community.

The Open House will be held on October 29 from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. at Polk County River Place, 2309 Euclid Avenue. Stations will be set up around the room focusing on different aspects of the plan. The meeting will be informal - come for twenty minutes or stay for longer! The design team and officials will be on hand to collect your input and answer questions.

We will also be joined by a staff member from the City of Des Moines' Engineering Department to discuss forthcoming improvements to Franklin Avenue. Storm sewer work along Franklin Avenue will require sections of the roadway to be reconstructed. A variety of other improvements are being considered as part of the project. An open house was held in June, where approximately 50 northwest-side citizens came to learn and ask questions about features such as on-street parking, on-street bicycle lanes, and a multi-use path.

As always, the meeting will also include neighborhood news, public safety updates, and more. Please mark your calendar and invite your neighbors! This is our last chance to gather in 2018 and we look forward to a great turnout.

Local Elections Tuesday, November 5th

This year is the first year that our community will vote for both city council and school board on the same ballot. With At-large Councilman Chris Coleman's retirement, the race for his seat will be a big one. Plus, the mayor's race has a number of candidates too. Historically the municipal and school board elections produce the lowest level of voter turnout, but are arguably the elections that have the biggest impact on our day-to-day lives. We recommend you plan ahead to minimize any issues this November.

The Polk Co. Auditor's website (www.polkcountyiowa.gov/auditor/election/) has a bunch of resources available for you. Check your voter registration! Find your polling place! Print an absentee ballot request form! Also, if you plan to vote on election day don't forget to bring a government-issued photo ID or another acceptable document.

Snow Ordinance Reminders

It's hard to believe, but winter is just around the corner. Chances are good you may need a quick refresher on the city's snow ordinance. Here are the basics:

- City ordinance requires vehicles to be removed from snow routes while Public Works crews plow streets. Violators will recieve a \$35 fine and can also be towed.
- Once snow routes are cleared, city crews plow residential streets.
- Front-yard parking is illegal at all times.
- Complete details on Des Moines' snow ordinances can be found at www.dmsnow.org.

Also, below are some reminders about the city's requirements for snow removal on sidewalks. As always, MHNA encourages neighbors to help each other with snow removal. Please lend a hand to elderly or disabled neighbors who may not be able to clear their own sidewalks. Thanks to everyone for your help!

- City ordinance requires sidewalks to be shoveled 48 hours after a measurable snowfall.
- Sidewalks should be shoveled full length and width, according to the City of Des Moines.
- Those who don't clear their walks could be penalized. Historically, fines for noncompliance have been \$50 for the first offense, \$75 for a second violation, and \$100 for a third.
- City ordinance prohibits snow from being blown or thrown into the street.
- Pedestrian ramps on street corners should be shoveled.

Fall is the Time to Weatherproof Your Home!

The temperatures will be dropping soon. Now is the time to go around your house and seal up any gaps and cracks both inside and out. This simple task will save energy, prevent water damage, and prevent pest problems. Use caulk or spray foam around non-moving spaces in your home. Check outside for gaps or cracks in your foundation, around vent openings, plumbing pipes, and where windows meet your siding. Use caulking for gaps up to 1/4" and expanding foam for larger gaps. Weather stripping is best for areas that move or open, like doors and windows. Replace door sweeps to block drafts at the bottom of your exterior door.



In Des Moines, yard waste bags and carts are collected year-round. Just make sure that you get a sticker if it's not an official "Compost It!" bag. Set yard waste out on your regular collection day.



Got a Traffic Concern? Here's What to Do.



If you have a concern regarding traffic signals, traffic signage, pavement markings, street lighting, visual obstructions at intersections, or other design and safety concerns, you can contact the City's Traffic and Transportation Division at 515-283-4973.

If you have a concern that requires enforcement, such as speeding traffic or illegal parking, the Des Moines Police have set up a Traffic Complaint Hotline at 515-323-8375. The hotline is available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week. You must leave a voicemail message regarding your complaint. An investigator will be assigned to your complaint for follow-up. By leaving your name and phone number, the investigator will call you within 3-5 days to let you know the complaint was received. You will receive feedback from the investigator in approximately 14 days.
